

Researcher declaration to accompany the submission of written work (LAW LLM/PhD programmes)

As of Monday 4 March 2013 a new policy is in force at the Law Department. Henceforth, when submitting work for formal evaluation (for first years this is the May paper, for second years the 1/4 thesis, for third years the 2/3 thesis and for fourth years all drafts of the thesis, for LLM researchers the LLM thesis) you must fill in and submit the 'Declaration to accompany the submission of written work (LAW LLM/PhD programmes)'. The purpose of this declaration is twofold: on the one hand it specifies your rights as an author; correlatively it sets out your duties as author. By signing it you confirm you have read and understood the rules and regulations pertaining to written work submitted at the EUI. If you have any doubt as to whether your work complies, please consult your supervisor. The declaration contains some text that is in , you should select the words that apply to what you plan to submit and delete the rest. The [square brackets] in the second paragraph also require you to select which text is most apt and to delete the rest. In the final part of the form there is a declaration pertaining to written work. You can freely ignore this if it is not applicable. Please submit the form together with your work, but as a separate document (do not insert it into the submission). If you are submitting work electronically, you may also send a signed, scanned copy of the form. The declaration is available for downloading from the website under Rules and Forms:
